South West Indian Ocean Tuna Forum (SWIOTUNA) is a membership regional network of Civil Society and Private Sector Organisations from the Coastal Nations and Island States of Madagascar, Kenya, Tanzania, Mozambique, Comoros, South Africa, Mauritius, Seychelles, Reunion and Somalia. The Network was established in 2010.

SWIOTUNA is legally registered as an international Non-Governmental organization under section 10 of the Non-Governmental Organisations Coordination Act of Kenya as an international Non-Governmental organization (NGO). The Registration number is: OP.218/051/18-184/11297. It has a functional management and administrative secretariat hosted by Tuna Fisheries Alliance of Kenya (TUFAK) based in Mombasa, Kenya.

SWIOTUNA has a governing body of a seven member committee headed by the chair. The current chair is Community Action for Nature Conservation (CANCO). The other members are: Marine Stewardship Council (MSC)-South Africa, the Forum of Civil Society Organisations for Marine and Coastal Areas (FOSCAMC)-Mozambique, Blue Ventures-Madagascar, Nature Seychelles-Seychelles, World Wide Fund for Nature and Association Intervention Development Environment (AIDE)-Comoros.
